

# An Historic Build

### Homes for Our Troops Makes History with 100th Home Build in Fredericksburg, Virginia

What started at 9 a.m. Friday, April 1 ended 76 hours later as the occupancy certificate for the home of Marine Sgt. Kenny Lyon was issued. Following three days of building and the help of hundreds of volunteers, a 2,600-square-foot rambler in Fredericksburg, Virginia was ready for its owner to move in. And that he did as Sgt. Lyon was handed his key on Saturday, April 9.

That's the fastest construction job in the seven-year history of Homes for Our Troops. Lyon was on his second deployment in May 2006 when a mortar attack near Fallujah, Iraq, left him with severe injuries including a left leg amputation above the knee,

nerve damage to his left arm and hand, and a shattered jaw. It took 50 units of blood to save him. Local company Atlantic Builders was our Building Partner on the weekend's "build brigade," which involved an estimated 800 people laboring around the clock in shifts to meet the deadline. The foundation was laid, the well was dug and the plumbing was installed in advance of Friday, but most everything else was done this weekend.

This is the second home Atlantic Builders has built with Homes for Our Troops in the region. The first was done last year for Marine Sgt. Steve Kiernan, with whom Lyon was living.

Atlantic Builders and Homes for Our Troops held another Build Brigade on April 15th in Fredericksburg, Virginia for a specially adapted home for Army SGT Jude Recendez, who also was injured in Iraq in 2006.

### DATA SHOWS INCREASE IN AMPUTATIONS AMONG SERVICE MEMBERS LAST YEAR

The majority of American service members undergoing amputation for war wounds in 2010 lost more than one limb, according to data compiled from Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Germany, where all seriously injured veterans are treated.

By December, only onequarter of amputation surgery involved only one limb; three-quarters involved the loss of two or more limbs. During the first seven years of the Iraq and Afghanistan wars, only about six percent of seriously wounded soldiers underwent amputation.

for his latest role. We are extremely proud to introduce you to the man who is going to lead our campaign.

Born in Montpelier, Vermont, Gen. Cody graduated in 1972 from the United States Military Academy at West Point where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree. Advanced studies prepared a young Cody for the rigors of a military career, one during which he found himself flying helicopters, earning the designation of master Army Aviator and a place in the Army Aviation Hall of Fame, logging more than 5,000 hours of flight time, and ascending to leadership positions, most notably with the 101st Airborne Division. Yet, through what can only be described as a storied career, Gen. Cody never lost sight of his mission to lead.

"We are a team," he once shared with the Army News. "If you allow ego to reign, emotion will trump true leadership. You'll have a clash of egos instead of a discussion about skill sets, capabilities, and what is good for the organization."

Serving as the 31st Vice Chief of Staff, Army, Gen. Cody retired in August of 2008 at which time he joined L-3 Communications as Corporate Vice President. He was promoted last year to Vice President of Washington (D.C.) Operations.

General Cody and his wife Vicki have two sons; Clint and Tyler are active duty Army Helicopter pilots, both of whom have several combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan.
