HFOT is projecting to have completed 327 specially adapted custom homes for severely injured post-9/11 Veterans nationwide by the end of this fiscal year, with 61 of those homes delivered during our partnership.

Evidence-Based Programming

Providing the foundation of a specially adapted home to our nation's most severely injured Veterans ensures they are able to recover safely and thrive long after their service. The financial freedom from not paying a monthly mortgage means these Veterans and their spouses are free to explore entrepreneurship or pursue education and/or training, thus facilitating their return to the workforce.

Cited here are some of HFOT's programmatic results compiled from our 2020 survey as reported by our Veteran-home recipients.

AREA OF IMPACT:	Improved Outcomes for Veterans and Families Living in HFOT homes:
RECOVERY & DAILY LIVING	 95% Of Veterans have experienced a reduction in household stress 90% Of Veterans have regained some/much freedom and independence in daily living
FINANCIAL STABILITY	 57% Increase in family income 55% Decrease in family debt 76% Increase in family savings
CAREER/ EMPLOYMENT	99.5% Increase in employment rates for Veterans 285% Increase in employment rates for spouses/ caregivers
EDUCATION, CERTIFICATION OR TRAINING	Rates for Veterans who have obtained or are pursuing a degree or trade certification increased from 15% to 71%, while rates for spouses/caregivers increased from 14% to 80%
COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT & VOLUNTEERING	Rates for Veterans able to pay it forward through volunteering grew from 17% to 74%
