This year marks the 20th anniversary of Homes For Our Troops. Over the past two decades, we've worked tirelessly to build and donate specially adapted custom homes to our nation's severely injured

post-9/11 Veterans. Because of your generous support, over 400 Veterans and their families are now rebuilding their lives in HFOT homes, with another 63 home-build projects in various stages of construction underway nationwide.





# Looking Forward

Army SGT Chris Short



hris Short was a college student considering law school as a potential next step when he watched his country come under attack on September 11, a day that changed the trajectory of his future. He enlisted in the Army with two of his friends and deployed to Afghanistan in 2004 with the 2nd Battalion, 5th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division. "I loved the fraternity, the brotherhood. It was a family," he says.

On March 29, 2005, Sergeant Short was on a patrol when his vehicle drove over two anti-tank mines in Oruzgan, Afghanistan. He lost his right leg and sustained multiple severe injuries in the blast. "The worst issue was the traumatic brain injury," he recalls. "I couldn't take care of myself at all. I had to have the nurses help me, and I spent a lot of time in occupational therapy. I had to learn how to read and write again."

After years of hard work and extensive rehabilitation, his resolve and determination paid off. "I forget how many surgeries, but close to 30 total with 13 surgeries on my right arm because my elbow was fused. I don't have a full range of motion, but I've got most of it back. I can still shoot a compound bow," he says proudly.


Recently retired from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs where he worked as a peer support specialist in the suicide prevention, homeless, and PTSD programs, Chris is a single father who is busy raising his teenage daughter Caroline. The pair are watersports enthusiasts and share a passion for wakesurfing, often competing in events together for Wake for Warriors.

Future recipients of a specially adapted custom HFOT home in Florida, Chris and Caroline are looking forward to moving out of their inaccessible apartment. "To be able to navigate a home, cook for my daughter, do laundry, get in and out of the shower from my wheelchair—it would change

need to recover will be crucial. I've never been able to do that in a home I've lived in."

Most importantly, Chris would like HFOT donors and supporters to know his HFOT home will relieve stress and allow him to focus on the future. "The home will help reduce stress about getting my basic needs taken care of and recovering when I'm suffering complications from my injuries. The lack of a mortgage will be a huge stress relief financially and allow me to allocate some resources elsewhere, such as college funds, donating to ministries and charities, investing, and enjoying life with my family."

When asked what he's looking forward to most in his future specially adapted custom HFOT home, Chris sums it up in one word. "Everything," he says.

On September 21, 2024, Homes For Our Troops celebrated a significant milestone by delivering our 400th specially adapted custom home to Marine Lance Corporal Alberto Flores and his family in New Braunfels, Texas.

Texas Governor Greg Abbott joined HFOT President/CEO Tom Landwermeyer, HFOT Board Director and Texas Roadhouse CEO Jerry Morgan, and numerous HFOT Board Directors and military and community leaders to deliver remarks to over three hundred guests. LCpl Flores, who was severely injured in an improvised explosive device (IED) blast in Iraq, spoke at the event about what the home means to him and Elvira, his wife of more than twenty-five years whom he met in the eighth grade.

"This home means so much to me and my family and it's going to change my life; being able to have full access to the home and being able to finally wheel around in my wheelchair when I can't wear my prosthetic will make a world of difference," he said. "My wife has been worried about me for the last nineteen years. Always checking on me when I'm doing things around the house and making sure I'm all right. I'm glad this house is going to finally give us peace of mind."

Bubba's 33, and their affiliates Jaggers and the TXRH Support
Center worked together to generously fund the home, while HFOT
Gold National Partner Wayfair fully furnished the home.
ABC Supply Co., Inc. showed their continued support by attending
the 400th home celebration, as did multiple corporate partner
representatives, including Shaw Flooring, Cosentino, MITER Brands,
Sherwin Williams, and Populus Financial Group. Additionally, H-E-B
stocked the pantry for the Flores family.

While handing over the keys to the 400th home in the year of our 20th anniversary is a tremendous achievement, Homes For Our Troops remains focused on the mission ahead.

"We could not have reached this incredible milestone without the continued commitment of our patriotic donors, volunteers, and partners like Texas Roadhouse," says HFOT President/CEO, Brigadier General, USA (Ret) Tom Landwermeyer. "We are especially grateful


