A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of HFOT,

FY24 was a remarkable year of noteworthy milestones, celebrations, and achievements for Homes For Our Troops. We celebrated our 20th anniversary, delivered our 400th HFOT home, completed our 50th HFOT home in California, welcomed more than two dozen Veterans to the HFOT family, and handed over the keys of 31 specially adapted custom homes to deserving Veterans and their families.

During this fiscal year, we received over 45,000 donations from individual donors, corporate partners, foundations, and fundraisers. Because of your unwavering and generous support, we ended the year with \$44.6M in revenue, up 15.8% over FY23.

This Annual Impact Report highlights the significant and profound difference you are making in the lives of our nation's severely injured Veterans and their families. In addition to our financial results, several of this year's home recipients share how they are rebuilding their lives and benefiting from the gift of a specially adapted custom home.

While we celebrate the past year's achievements, we are focused on the work ahead. Based on U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs numbers, we estimate there are nearly 1,800 more post-9/11 Veterans still in need of a specially adapted HFOT home. This is why our mission remains critical.

As we kick off a new year, with your continued commitment and support, I am confident we will further our mission of Building Homes and Rebuilding Lives. Together, we can restore some of the freedom and independence our Veterans sacrificed while serving our nation.

On behalf of HFOT's staff and Board of Directors, thank you for a tremendous year. We look forward to what we can accomplish together in 2025.





* HFOT incurred a large deficit in FY24 as it was the 20th anniversary year with a goal to complete and transfer 31 homes, one of which was its 400th home. The deficit was partially offset by the surpluses accumulated over the past three fiscal years. HFOT's usual operational policy is to operate within a balanced budget.

HFOT received over \$4.7 million in donated materials, labor, and advertising in FY24, which allowed us to stretch our monetary support and assist additional severely injured post-9/11 Veterans.
